The final preparations are underway for one the biggest projects ever undertaken by the Ecole de Musique ‘Erik Satie’, Honfleur. With the visiting Radley College Symphony Orchestra we have been gradually signing up French children of all ages to participate in a multi-level orchestra using a selection of works from the BBC Ten Pieces repertoire. At the time of writing we are at 108 participants, and we are looking forward to filling the huge Greniers a Sel concert hall in Honfleur with music on Sunday 12th February at 5pm.

Having lots of fun at....

Festyland!

We love Festyland! This is Normandy's largest amusement park, complete with a Viking theme running throughout. The size of the park is perfect for a packed half-day of fun, with over thirty different rides suitable for a wide range of ages.

Based just to the West of Caen, we often schedule this visit back-to-back with either Bayeux (for the Tapestry Museum and Cathedral) or the D-Day Landing Beaches, both places which can incorporate musical performances. The surface area of the park is relatively compact, meaning that students can explore at their leisure without getting lost, and four restaurants are available for lunches and snacks.

Juno Beach Centre

A tour to the Pays d'Auge can also incorporate a visit to the D-Day Landing Beaches, and there are many different locations and museums to choose from.

The Juno Beach Centre at Arranches-les-Bains is a fascinating place to visit, the students learn about the events of D-Day and can also have a guided tour of one of the bunkers.

This can lead onto a musical performance on the beachfront promenade outside the museum, which is always a busy area in the summer months.
